

cast signals, there are a couple of options.

The easiest alternative, Felvine said, would be to buy what is called a digital-to-analog converter box, which costs \$40 to \$50. There was a federal program to help pay for these boxes, but it ran out of money last year.

"A coupon program was created by the government to help defray the cost of converter boxes" said Rod Thomasson, director of broadcasting at Colby Community College. "In late 2008, the program ran out of money. Eligible households are still able to apply for a coupon but will be put on a ... waiting list."

The New York Times reported that in Kansas alone, one congressional district had more than 4,000 names on the list. A second option would be to buy


