# Tools help make tasks easier to all

Five members of the Morning Glory Family and Community Education group presented information on "assistive technology' to the Senior Progress Center on Thursday and demonstrated various aids available to people who can use a helping hand with everyday activities.

The group showed the seniors an apparatus to assist in taking off a gas cap if fingers are stiff from arthritis. The device was a rubberized 'lid-like thing' with a twist arm; for someone with difficulty bending over, there was a simple apparatus to help pull on a pair of socks; there was also an assistive device for pulling up zippers, a long-handled shoe spoon, also a magnifying glass on a frame that covered both pages of a book at the same time.

There seemed to be no end to all the personal aids available to people needing assistance because of changes in vision, mobility, strength, and other special needs.

"This assumes 80 percent emergence for a final stand of about 105,000 plants per acre," Roozeboom said.

In high-yield, irrigated environments, the final stand should be tension crop production and crop- closer to 150,000 plants per acre.

These recommendations are less than in the mid-1990s, he added.

"Research has shown that weed suppression by the soybean canopy is not as important ... as it had been in the past because of the widespread use of glyphosateresistant varieties," he said.
