Doug attended grad and high school in Atwood graduating with the Class of 1964. He graduated from Colby Community College in criminal justice in 1972. Doug served his country in the United States Navy from 1965 to 1969 on the USS New Jersey at Long Beach, Calif., and went to Vietnam. He also served in the reserves until 1971. Doug was awarded the National Defense Service Medal, Vietnam Service Medal with one Bronze Star and the Republic of Vietnam Campaign Medal with device.
