

Hints from Heloise

Vinegar helps clean stains in toilet bowls

Dear Heloise: I have a dark stain inside the TOILET BOWL at the waterline. Any hints on removing it once and for all? – Barbara, Houston

It could be mold or mildew that forms, especially in humid conditions like Houston! One hint: Pour several cups of full-strength white or applecider vinegar into the bowl. Let stand for five to 10 minutes, then scrub and flush. Still there? Remove the water from the bowl (turn off the water valve to the tank and flush until the bowl is empty). Place toilet paper around the bowl, saturate with vinegar and let soak for a while, rewetting several times. Then, scrub with a plastic brush – do not use anything that will scratch.

If the stain remains, you may need to use a commercial toilet-bowl cleaner. Some have warnings to use only on white fixtures, since they can etch the colored ones. Be sure to read the labels carefully. – Heloise

P.S.: Scrub the toilet daily, or as often as possible (just brush, you don't need a cleaning agent), to help prevent buildup. It takes less than 30 seconds.

SPARKLING-CLEAN BATHROOM

Dear Heloise: My bathroom stays sparkling clean because I clean it daily, and it's easy. At night when I take a bubble bath, I lay a clean washcloth by the tub to wash the surface and fixtures. After I finish my nightly routine, that same washcloth is used to clean the vanity top. The next day, after I have done my morning routine and put on my makeup, I use a microfiber cloth to clean the vanity, fixtures and mirrors. Bidding Quiz

1. Redouble. Action over a takeout double usually takes one of three forms. A pass normally indicates a poor hand, or one where there is no particularly good reason to bid; bidding a new suit shows a hand between five and nine high-card points where it seems desirable to mention the suit; a redouble announces a hand containing at least 10 high-card points.

The redouble says nothing about the distributional nature of the responder's hand. The redoubler may or may not have support for opener's suit. One possibility is that the best result may be achieved by doubling the opponents when they remove the redouble to another contract.

For this reason, the opening bidder usually passes at his next turn to allow the redoubler the opportunity to double whatever suit the opponents name. In the given case, you plan to double either one heart or one spade at your next turn, and to bid two spades (forcing) if the opposition bids clubs.

2. One notrump. Unless you apprise partner of your high-card strength and balanced distribution at this point, it may become awkward later on for you to enter the bidding conveniently. One notrump informs partner that you have scattered values so that he may continue to compete as his hand dictates. The notrump bid over the double shows six to nine high-card points.

3. One heart. Counting distribution, your hand is surely worth 10 points, but distributional points are not included in a redouble. As regards which suit to bid, it is much more advisable to bid hearts now and show your diamond support later, since you would prefer to end up in hearts if partner can support that suit.

Then too, given your shortness in the black suits, the bidding is likely to become very spirited, and your side will be better placed if you get your heart suit in now before supporting diamonds later (if partner does not support hearts).

4. Pass. There is no need to panic because of your singleton diamond. The odds are great that the next player will respond to his partner's double by bidding a suit or one notrump. Even if he passes instead, expecting to defeat one diamond doubled, your partner still has a chance to rescue himself if he is unhappy with that contract.

A one-notrump bid would be incorrect, as it would serve to rescue the opposition, who are likely to wind up playing in one of your four-card suits


