16th Selden show features classic cars and antique tractors

The Selden Community Foundation is preparing for the Sixteenth Annual Antique Tractor and Classic Car Show. This annual event will be held on Main St. in Selden, on Sunday, June 7, and promises a day filled with fun family activities, antique and classic tractors, cars, small engines and more.

This year's show begins with registration at 9 a.m. at the north end of Main Street, on Kansas Avenue. There is no fee for entries or for attending. Exhibits will be on display throughout the day, with most activities taking place in and around the city park. Plaques will be awarded for the top five tractors, top five cars, and top two small engines.

The fun and games begin at 10 a.m. with a horseshoe-pitching contest on the south side of the tennis courts. At 11:30 a.m., the Basketball Free Throw contest will begin on the tennis courts. Medals will be awarded for first, second, and third place in two age divisions — grades 3, 4, 5 and grades 6, 7, 8. At 1 p.m., there will be a Kiddie Tractor Pull. Children can test their strength and skill by pulling a weighted sled with a pedal tractor. Trophies will go to the top three pullers in each age group -5-6, 7-8, 9-10. Other activities for the kids include barrel train rides, families and friends, met May 23 a corn tank with hidden treasures, and the children's raffle.

Grilled hamburgers, barbecue pork sandwiches, hot dogs, baked beans, and drinks to whet your appetite and quench your thirst will be served throughout the day near the city park. Other cool treats will be available in the afternoon.

Rose Bainter and Vic Wagoner, Jr. will provide live entertainment in the park over the noon hour. Seating in the park is limited, so bring your own lawn chairs and blankets. The Old-Time Band will perform in the parish hall in the afternoon. Spectators are welcome to join in the singing and dancing.

pedal tractor and an all-terrain tricycle along with other prizes. Raffle tickets are \$1 each or 6 for \$5 and can be purchased in advance from The Bank in Selden. Tickets can also be purchased at the announcers stand the day of the show. Children will have the opportunity to put their names in for a free children's raffle.

Raffle prizes will be drawn just prior to the parade at 3:30 p.m. The parade, the final event of the day, will run past the north end of the city park. This allows everyone a relaxed and enjoyable opportunity to see the entries as they drive past. The plaque awards will be announced and distributed to winning entries as they parade past the announcers stand.
