Hot weather deadly for kids in vehicles

As temperatures begin to heat up, children are at a serious risk for heat stroke when left alone even for a few minutes in a closed vehicle, says the Kansas Department of Health and Environment. across the United States died from heatstroke caused by being left or trapped in a car.

"A child is our most precious cargo, and drivers must know entirely preventable," said Jan Stegelman, director of Safe Kids Kansas. "No one ever thinks it would happen to them, and that is why it's essential to get this message out, especially as the weather starts heating up."

Heat is much more dangerous to left in a hot vehicle, a child's core body temperature may increase three to five times faster than that of an adult. This could cause permanent injury or even death. Heat stroke occurs when the core body temperature reaches 104 degrees Fahrenheit. A core body temperature of 107 can kill.

"The inside of a vehicle can rise 19 degrees above the outside temperature in just 10 minutes," said tally forgetting a child.

A few minutes might not seem Stegelman. "After an hour, the like a long time, but it can mean temperature inside and outside of the difference between life and a vehicle can differ by 45 degrees death to a child trapped in a hot or more - even if the window is left open a crack."

Safe Kids USA and General Motors created the Never Leave Your Child Alone program to educate families on the dangers kids face in hot vehicles.

According to research at San Last year, at least 42 children Francisco State University, even with relatively cool temperatures outside—70 degrees—the inside of a car can reach a dangerous temperature in just minutes.

The research also revealed that that these deaths and injuries are more than half of these children were accidentally left behind in a parked car by parents or caregivers and nearly a third were trapped while playing in a vehicle

> Safe Kids suggests these tips: • Teach children not to play in, on or around vehicles.

• Never leave a child unattended children than it is to adults. When in a vehicle, even with the window slightly open.

> • Always lock a vehicle's doors and trunk - especially at home. Keep keys and remote-entry devices out of children's reach.

• Place something that you'll need at your next stop - such as a purse, a lunch, gym bag or briefcase – on the floor of the back seat by the child. This simple act could help prevent you from acciden-

Terry Drenner, a 16-year veteran of programs dealing with independent living centers, is founder and director of the service, with a 10-member board to assist him.


The office is at 640 N. Franklin Ave., in the former Past Times building.


