Eagles’ basketball coach accepts job in Wyoming

Beau Sheets has resigned as coach of the Colby High School boys basketball team to take a job in Wyoming.

Sheets said he and his family will be moving to Riverton, where he coach the boys varsity basketball team and be an assistant coach for the football team at Wind River High School.

Sheets described his departure from Colby as a family move. He said his sister Sandra lives in Riverton and her daughters, 4 and 6, are close with his children. He said the pay would be a little better and it would allow his wife Tara be able to stay home and take care of the children. The couple

has three children, Camdyn, 5; Ty, 3; and Clay, 1.

Sheets had nothing but good things to say about the time he spent at Colby.

“Everything has been great,” he said. “I have enjoyed the town, the community and the school. The parents and community have really embraced the team. The community always made my wife and I feel welcome.”

In his three years as head coach, Sheets posted a 46-22 record. The team went 11-10 in his first year in 2006-2007, 18-6 the second year and 17-6 this season. Before taking the high school job, Sheets was coach of the Colby Middle School eighth grade basketball team in 2004-2005 and served as assistant coach of the varsity team the next year.

Sheets said one of his fondest memories of coaching the Eagles was during his first year when, Tom Bowen served as his assistant coach. Sheets said Bowen coached him when he was a player at Colby High.

“He taught me that one game or one quarter doesn’t really matter,” Sheets said. “He showed me there’s a lot more to being a basketball coach then just the score.”

He said he enjoyed coaching this year’s team because he had coached the seniors since they were eighth graders.

“I feel like I know each one of those boys,” said Sheets.

He said it’s hard to leave because he had high hopes for next year’s team, which he said will really surprise people.

Rockies defeat Milwaukee, win sixth straight on the road

MILWAUKEE (AP) — Jim Tracy’s Colorado Rockies road show just keeps rolling.

Trailing by two runs to the Milwaukee Brewers, the Rockies rallied to take the lead with three runs in the seventh inning and continue their recent road resurgence with a 3-2 victory Tuesday night.

The Rockies now have won six straight on the road under Tracy, their recently named new manager — including a four-game sweep of the Cardinals.

“The great thing about the last eight to 10 days is that they’re having success and their confidence is growing,” said Tracy, who took

over for Clint Hurdle on May 29.

It was a big night for recent Triple-A call-up Carlos Gonzalez, who had a pair of doubles and an RBI. Colorado might have started slow under Hurdle, but Gonzalez has known nothing but winning under Tracy since he was recalled June 5.

“It’s a great feeling to win every game that I’ve been here,” Gonzalez said.

Rockies starter Jason Hammel (3-3) gave up only two runs and five hits in six innings, but Colorado’s offense had a tough time scoring off of Brewers starter Braden Loooper.

The Rockies finally broke through in the seventh, as back-to-back doubles by Troy Tulowitzki and Gonzalez cut the Brewers’ lead to 2-1. Loooper left the game, and Gonzalez stole third base off reliever Mark DiFelice.

DiFelice got Chris Iannetta to pop out and was replaced by Todd Coffey, who walked pinch hitter Seth Smith. Coffey (1-1), who had been considered a solid addition to Milwaukee’s bullpen going into Tuesday’s game, then surrendered the lead when Clint Barmes’ sacrifice fly to center scored Smith and put Colorado ahead 3-2.

Colby Swim Club squad places first in Burlington

The Colby swim team came home winners, placing first out of eight teams at the Burlington, Colo., meet on June 6 with 286 points overall.

The team got another solid performance from Brennon Overton, who claimed three more golds. Overton, first in the boys 15-18 year-old 25-yard butterfly with 16.23, in the 100-yard freestyle with 1:15.36 and in the 25-yard individual medley with 1:33.53. He was coming off a great first meet of the season at Holyoke, where he placed first in the same events, breaking pool records in the freestyle and the butterfly with times of 14.31 and 16.49 respectively.

Jessica Leiker looked took three top medals again, taking first in the 15-18 year-old 100-yard freestyle with 1:03.65, in the 50-yard freestyle with 28.08 and in the 100-yard breaststroke with 1:20.74.

Kalen Rasmussen also had three first, in the 50-yard freestyle with 23.94, the 100-yard freestyle with 54.12 and the 100-yard breaststroke with 1:13.30.
