Normally, this would be one more regular task in the life of a parish pastor. Today, as I compose this epistle, it is clearly on my heart that it

is the last one I will write as the pastor of Trinity Lutheran Church in Colby. I am retiring in July, and Deanna and I will soon be moving to our retirement home in Nebraska.

Many thoughts fill my mind as I consider what I want to say. What can I say that will make a difference? What can I say that will have continuing blessing to this community? What can I say as I prepare to say farewell to a town and a congregation I have learned to love?

What are the final words I would like to leave you with as retirement steps across the threshold of my life?

There are two.

First of all, remember to keep that which is important in prayer. Sounds simple enough, but it isn't always easy, is it? For example, what is important for which we pray? Consider these: Give thanks to God for His mercy shown to us, and give thanks for the daily needs of life He provides. That's the first thing I'd like you to think about.

The second is our usefulness to God in this community. St. Francis of Assisi wrote:

Where there is despair, hope; Where there is sadness, joy;

Where there is darkness, light. O Divine Master,

It is in pardoning that we are pardoned;


It is in dying that we are born again to Eternal Life.


