If you were religious, how might you be changed? Some of us believe that there is only one way To those who, if asked, "Are you to salvation, while others claim there are a variety of paths. And still others scoff at the very idea of some kind of eternal salvation.

Some think regular worship with a community of like believers is one of the most important things they can do, while others find individual time spent in spiritual reflection to be the highest form of worship.

How and where and why do you worship? If you don't, why not?

I ask all these questions because I think it is important to understand our own beliefs before we can really understand or even criticize what others might believe. We are quick to judge others without first examining our own beliefs, motives and behaviors. We are often too ready to play God, rather than letting God be God.

It really is so easy to just say the other person is wrong without taking a good look at where we might be in error.

Why not take a brief look at your own faith and see what you might learn about yourself and your God? Perhaps the first step in becoming religiously literate is to know ourselves better. Then, and only then, we might be better prepared to move on to learn about


