She also was preceded in death by two brothers, Vincent and John Lubbers; and five sisters, Catherine Kemp, Marge Barlow, Mary

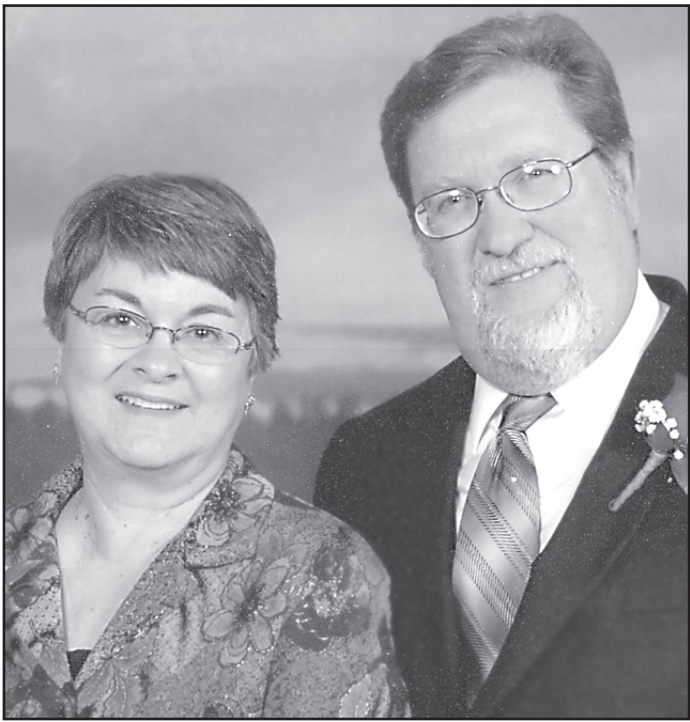
New pastor comes to Colby

The Carltons moved here from Ogallala, Neb., where Mark was a pastor for almost 22 years. He spent the first 18 years of his time in Ogallala preaching for the Berean Church. His congregation then merged with the Evangelical Free Church, where he served as associate pastor for three years.

The pastor began his ministry in Wellington, Colo., where he
