K-18 squad loses 5-0, ending four-game streak

The Colby K-18 baseball team suffered a 5-0 shutout loss to rival Goodland on Sunday at the Colby Recreational Complex.

The Colby boys struggled at the plate, and six of the players were called out on third strikes.

“We were too hesitant at the plate,” said Coach Russell Rodenbeck. “We didn’t get their pitcher out of his rhythm.”

Eighth-grader Dylan Slavens started the game for Colby. The contest remained scoreless until Goodland ticked off 4 runs in the top of the third. That occurred after sophomore Jordan Rasmussen replaced Slavens with no outs, the bases loaded and the game still tied at 0.

Goodland scored its first run when Rasmussen walked a batter. They scored two more runs on a single and picked up another before the inning came to a close. The first three runs were charged to Slavens, while the fourth was charged to Rasmussen.

Sophomore Dalton Snyder pitched the fourth and fifth for Colby. He garnered two strikeouts and gave up no runs in the top of the fourth, but allowed one run to score on a passed ball in the top of the fifth.

Colby picked up two wins in a doubleheader against WaKeeney on June 29, winning game one 18-3 and game two 5-0.

WaKeeney scored two runs in the bottom of the first to take an early 2-0 lead. Colby came roaring back in the top of the third with a 15-run offensive explosion that gave the team a 13-point lead.

The boys scored three more in the top of the fourth and sophomore starter Jake Thompson pitched a scoreless inning in the second half of the inning to give Colby an 18-3 victory.

Thompson struck out six while giving up four hits. The game ended early because the league rules stipulate that if a team is leading by more than 15 runs after three innings or more than 10 runs after five, and the opposing team has already batted, it is declared the winner. In league play the first game is always seven innings and the second game is five innings.

Snyder went 3 for 4 and Thompson went 2 for 4.

Rasmussen started game two for Colby. He gave up three hits while pitching five scoreless innings.

Colby picked up a run in the top of the second and scored two more in the top of the third to take a 3-0 lead. The team got one run each in the next two innings on their way to a win. Stones went 1 for 2 in the game. Rasmussen and freshman Trek Keck each had a hit.

Colby swept McCook in a doubleheader with two decisive victories on June 28 at the recreation complex.

The first game ended after three innings due to the 10 run limit that exists in five inning games. The rule is that if one team is leading by 10 or more runs after three innings or eight or more after four and the opposing team has already batted, it is declared the winner.

Stones started for Colby, giving up just one hit in three innings. Snyder, Rasmussen, Stones, Thompson and freshman Troy Quenzer all went 1 for 2 in the game and sophomore Caleb Carter went 1 for 1.

Snyder started game two for Colby. He struck out seven while giving up two hits.

Snyder, Stones, Carter, Thompson and eighth-grader Wiatt Binder each had one hit.

The boys are now 13-1 in league play and 18-3 overall. The team will play a doubleheader at 6:30 p.m. Thursday at Oakley.

Colby runners triumph in races at Atwood Lake

Albert Kipleting and Colby Community College sophomore Scarla Nero of Thomas County were two of the big winners at the County Challenge race on the fourth of July at Lake Atwood in Rawlins County.

Kipleting won the 8K race (about five miles) with a time of 28 minutes, 35.22 seconds, while

Nero finished first in the 4K (about 2.5 miles) with 16:45.68.

Luke Friess of Sheridan County was second in the 8K with 33:13.73 and Katie Friess of Sheridan County was second in the 4K with 18:44.20.

Thomas County’s men’s team came in second with a score of 10,107. Sheridan County placed

first with 27,422. The Thomas County women’s team finished fourth with a score of 3,263. Rawlins County placed first with 33,742.

Seventeen women and 13 men competed at the event, included people from as far away as St. Charles, Mo., and Denver.

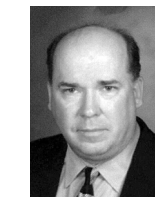
