Good crop, good food spell good sunflower future

hold the No. 1 spot in production of sunflowers like they do for wheat, Red River Commodities considered it an ideal place for a plant and encouraging farmers to dedicate acreage to the crop.

The hybrid sunflower is a good crop for western Kansas because of its extensive root system, which aids the plant during dry conditions experienced in the area. The marketable sunflower is so hybridized that if you were to plant one of the harvested seeds it would revert back to wild in the first year. Unlike hybrid sunflowers, the wild ones have multiple heads, and are so common to Kansas they are actually a serious weed problem.

On the average year, between 2,600 and 2,800 pounds to the acre under irrigation is considered a good yield. On occasion 3,000 pounds to the acre can be reached. Most dry land sunflowers average 1,200 pounds to the acre.

"The confectionery seed differs from the oil seed in looks, and western Kansas grows the nicest-looking seeds," said Dee Olson, administrator of the Colby plant, "the seeds are black with a very pretty little white stripe on them."

The Colby plant is considered an in-shell plant, although they also hull and sell some kernels. Some kernels are shipped to the roasting plant in Fargo.

Red River began five years ago making sun butter from the sunflower kernel. The kernel is a very low trans-fat food source, which makes sun butter a good alternative to peanut butter. Their Sun-Gold Foods plant is in Horace, N.D.

"Some school districts are taking foods with peanuts from their menus and replacing it with sun butter," Olson said. "Adverse reaction to sunflowers is a rarity."
