## SR-71 pilot to visit museum

by an SR-71 "Blackbird" hanging overhead in the lobby. Saturday and Sunday, former SR-71 pilot, "Buz" Carpenter will be at the Cosmosphere to talk about the famous plane. Carpenter flew the Blackbird now housed at the Cosmosphere.

At 11 a.m. and 2 p.m. on Saturday, and at 2 p.m. Sunday, Carpenter will offer a presentation that's free and open to the public, during which he will discuss the Blackbird and his experiences as a pilot. After Sunday's presentation at the Cosmosphere, Carpenter will talk with people about the plane and its features.

Carpenter flew Blackbirds as an aircraft commander and later as an instructor pilot, with over 60 operational missions. He also flew in the C-141, RF-4C, and T-38 planes, flying 150 combat hours in Vietnam. He worked in the Pentagon and served as Wing commander at Ramstein Air Base in German during Operations Desert Shield and Desert Storm.

He retired as a Colonel after serving as the 2nd Air Force Vice Commander, responsible for all the USAF Intelligence,

> All of it has to be determined by Jan. 12 so the district can begin deciding what kind of staff training will be needed. The staff will need to decide if outside experts will be needed and how ideas that have worked in other schools can be adapted here.
