





LESS-STEEL SINKS, and we get lots of questions about how to care for them. So, here are the Heloise hints:

• Do not clean with harsh or abrasive detergents.

• Don't use greasy or oily rags to clean sink. • Wipe sink down regularly with baby, mineral

or vegetable oil.

• Spray sink with a mixture of white vinegar and water, and buff dry.

• During and after cleaning, always rinse with lots of water.

• Don't use muriatic acid (or any cleaners like tile or grout cleaner that contain it), since it causes dark stains that you can't remove.

• Don't clean with chlorine bleach or use any cleaners that have it as an ingredient.

GLASS-TOP STOVES

Dear Heloise: I found that the cheapest way to clean glass-top stoves is to wet a sponge or dishrag, then dip it in baking soda. Rinse and wipe dry with paper towels. It gets off burnt-on spills with little effort. - Toni Lynch, via e-mail



You are West, defending against Four Spades after South opened with three spades and was raised by North to four. You lead the king of hearts. on which East plays the three and South the four. When you next lead the ace of hearts, East plays the six and South the eight. Which card would you play at trick three? NORTH

Test Your Defensive Play

This problem comes from the book "More Killing Defence at Bridge" by the brilliant Scottish player/writer Hugh W. Kelsey. The hand is another example of why experts agree that defense **16** is the most difficult part of the game.

The correct play at trick three is the queen of hearts! You should play the queen even though 18 you know your partner has the missing ten of hearts (because he did not play high-low to show a doubleton).

When declarer ruffs the heart and plays a trump, you grab the ace and lead another heart to kill dummy's jack. East ruffs and declarer overruffs, but South later loses a club trick and goes down one. This was South's hand at the start:

- K Q J 10 8 5 2 **[S]** [H]84
- 9 [D]

WAS THAT EARLY

[C] J 6 2

Now let's suppose you had shifted to a diamond at trick three, which seems the more natural thing to do. In that case, South can make the contract 31 with correct play. He wins the diamond with the ace and leads a trump to his king. You take the ace and lead another diamond.

South ruffs, cashes the queen of trumps, leads a club to dummy's king, ruffs the nine of hearts and plays two more trumps to produce this position: D

dummy discards a heart; if you discard a heart, dummy discards a club. Either way, declarer makes the last three tricks and the contract.

West must be exceptionally alert to foresee what might happen to him if he fails to lead the queen of hearts at trick three. But that's the highly demanding type of game bridge is.
