
The Colby High varsity volleyball team went 1-1 in its home triangular with St. Francis and Oberlin on Tuesday in the high school gym.


The game featured several penalties being called on both sides of the ball. Both teams continued to battle it out but Quinter eventually prevailed, defeating the Bulldogs 44-26.
