Brewster dominates Cheylin 32-6; coach pleased with team's defense

Dominating on both offense and defense, the Triplains-Brewster Titans rolled past the Cheylin Cougars in Western Kansas Liberty League action last Friday night, posting a score of 32-6.

Cheylin received the kick-off to start the game, and completed a pass for a first down. The Titan defense held strong after that, taking over on fourth down on their own 31 yard

Triplains-Brewster was unable to get anything going on offense, and Tad Sheets punted to the Cougars. After a Cheylin penalty and outstanding defensive pass coverage by Sheets and Spencer Holm, the Cougars' short punt gave the Titans great field advantage on

However, a penalty by the Titans, and tough defense by the Cougars again forced the Titans to punt. The Cougars were held for no gain, and it was the Titans' turn on offense. A 12yard pass from quarterback Brett Gfeller to Holm gave the Titans a first down. On the next play, Gfeller again connected with Holm on a short pass over the middle that he took 40 yards for a Titan's touchdown. At the end of the first quarter, the Titans led 6-0.
