Senate approves official apology to Native Americans in defense bill

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Senate has approved a resolution apologizing to American Indians for years of “ill-conceived policies” and acts of violence against Native Americans by the U.S. government.
Lawmakers said the resolution, which was included in a defense spending bill approved late Tuesday, was a symbolic gesture meant to promote healing and a renewed commitment to tribal communities. It was introduced by Kansas Republican Sam Brownback and Democrat Byron Dorgan of North Dakota.
Brownback has pushed for the measure since 2004. The Senate approved a similar resolution in 2008 as part of a bill to increase the budget for Indian health care, but the measure died in the House. Lawmakers are also developing a law to improve health care and bolster public safety on reservations.
The current apology resolution is careful to state that it is not meant to authorize or support any claim against the U.S. government or serve as a settlement

of any claim. It “recognizes that there have been years of official depredations, ill-conceived policies and the breaking of covenants by the federal government regarding tribes,” and “apologizes on behalf of the people of the United States to all Native Peoples for many instances of violence, maltreatment and neglect inflicted on” American Indians.
It urges President Barack Obama to “acknowledge the wrongs of the United States against Indian tribes” in order to encourage healing.
Lawmakers who represent large tribal communities said it should not stand in place of additional federal aid for health care and public safety.
“Native Americans deserve an apology, but they deserve much more than that,” said Sen. Tim Johnson, D-S.D.
“The real issue, I think, is what are we doing to improve the conditions on the reservations,” said Sen. John Thune, R-S.D.

Fog may predict foul weather this fall

Maybe it’s human nature, but people have always looked for signs and portents of what the weather will be like in the upcoming season.
Reports have it that the latest Farmer’s Almanac is predicting a severe winter, said Mary Knapp, climatologist for the State of Kansas. But the Climate Prediction

Center outlook has the odds tilted towards a milder-than-normal winter in Kansas.
Knapp, who runs the Kansas Weather Data Library based at Kansas State University, said “One folk tale you might want to be aware of this year: For every day with fog in August there will be a snowfall in the winter. With

Wichita and Salina both reporting 12 days with fog, it will be interesting to see if we have 12 snow events this year.”

zar, a former rancher, called that idea a nonstarter.
“The fact is that the American public has shown that it does not want to have slaughtering of these animals,” he said.
Rep. Nick Rahall, D-W.Va., chairman of the House Natural Resources Committee, welcomed Salazar’s plan, which he said would reverse decades of government policies that treated wild horses and burros as a nuisance.
“Years of attempts by the bureau to shoehorn these magnifi-

cent animals into ever-shrinking territory has manufactured an overcrowding problem,” Rahall said. “Restoring horses and burros to the acreage from which they have been needlessly removed is critical.”
Spokesman Tom Gorey said the bureau would work with state and local officials to create the preserves — essentially large ranches — and make them accessible to the public.
“We think there is real potential for ecotourism,” he said. “Everybody loves horses.”

- Messages to members’ doctors and other providers, family members and friends informing them about the directives.
- Automatic notification if state laws or requirements change in a way that requires person to update their directives.
- A national legal support network that verifies that directives are legal and accurate.

“It’s purely about what kind of care you want when you can no long take care of yourself,” said Brouthers. “You can get access to your directives using toll-free numbers from anywhere in the world.”
This means family and friends will not have to grapple with life-and-death decisions based on what they think their loved one would have wanted, said Brouthers.
He said the process is behind schedule. He said the building for the call center at 455 N. Franklin Ave. is basically finished except for a few leaky windows. Refurbishing the building cost the company more

than expected, he said, and the firm ended up spending about \$100,000 over the budget.
The City Council originally approved giving the firm \$400,000 to renovate and buy the building, said City Manager Carolyn Armstrong. She said the council gave an extra \$81,815, with the firm covering the rest, when it became apparent the project would cost more than expected.
“It really complicated the project,” Brouthers added.
The company hired Strait and Associates in Colby to refurbish the building. Owner Glenn Strait said the building was in sad structural condition, worse than expected.
“It was not consistent with structurally sound practices of today,” he said. “We had to re-work the structure of the building. We added 38 columns with supplement beams over them to stabilize the structure.”
Brouthers conceded that it probably would have been less expensive to tear down the building and build a new one in its place.
