County committee elections begin today across the nation

ministrator Jonathan Coppess says that 2009 county ers who serve on these committees make decisions committee elections will begin today, with the U.S. Department of Agriculture mailing ballots to eligible

The deadline to return the ballots to your county office or mail them is Monday, Dec. 7.

"It is imperative that all eligible farmers and ranchers get involved and vote in this year's county committee elections," said Coppess. "County committee members will provide input and make important decisions on, among other things, the local administration of new disaster and conservation programs under the 2008 Farm Bill. I particularly encourage minority and women producers to get involved so that county committees fairly represent the produc-

County committees provide a link between farm-

WASHINGTON — Farm Service Agency Ad- ers and the department, he said. Farmers and ranchon commodity price support loans and payments, conservation programs, incentive indemnity and disaster payments for some commodities, emergency programs and payment eligibility.

Those who participate in an agency program may be eligible to serve. Farmers in each county submitted candidate nominations last summer. Eligible voters who do not receive ballots can obtain one at their county office.

Close to 7.750 county committee members serve the 2,248 Farm Service offices nationwide, Coppess said. Each panel consists of three to 11 members who serve three-year terms, with a third of the seats up for election each year.
