
Weather Corner

the sidewalk blocking their way. They also pointed out that there are not a lot of places to sit and rest downtown.

The blind group found a lot of difficulty in being guided by another person. Whitney Schultz said many times the guides got distracted or gave bad directions, causing the person being blind to run into something.

Before returning to Sunflower Bank, most of the students tried being blind.

"The curbs are a hazard," Gaiwith said, "They can

catch you off guard." The students discussed how seeing what it's like to be disabled might help them in a leadership situ-

"If you know how they feel you can help accommodate them," she said. "You have to make sure you're hearing these voices."

Some of the students also took the lessons back to their own lives. Schultz said being disabled would be hard at the Brewster school.

"We do have an elevator, but I don't trust that thing," she said.

This week, the students will be going to Colby Community College to test their leadership skills.

They will break into pairs and come up with a 30-minute activity similar to those they have been doing in the class. Dr. Michael Thompson, director of the criminal justice program at the college, will be picking some of his students to participate in the

The students will also pick a class service project to do, which will take them several months to complete.

Thomas said the Leadership Thomas County board, who also runs the adult class, has been running the youth class for 18 years. Students have to apply for the class, and the administrators at each of the schools are always on the lookout for students who might do well.

"The schools have been very supportive," she

Thomas said the class is not for students at the top of their class, but for those who might need their confidence built up or need a little encouragement

The adult Leadership Thomas County class runs every two to three years. Thomas said she is currently looking for people to enroll in the coming session, which will be this fall. Anyone interested can contact Thomas at (785) 460-3401.

dispatch a second truck to collect yard waste, but now it combines the yard waste with municipal solid waste in one truck. The combination takes up extra space in the landfill, and is against the landfill operational the problem," said Commisplan, he said. The landfill's plan is to save space by composting the yard waste, in order to keep the tonnage down. They are allowed only 20 tons a day. Sometimes just a little extra effort is necessary to comply with the regulations in order to lengthen the life of the landfill, he said.

"Also our records show we charged the city \$941 to dispose of concrete, and spent \$11,000 to crush it and then let the city redeem it for free," he said.

Jumper also said that the city

indicated their cost of demolishing unfit structures would greatly increase with the newly structured landfill fees. However, a copy of city records show that in 2009, no unfit structures were demolished.

"We're really not the one with sioner Paul Steele, "but if the city would like to meet, they are more than welcome to schedule a time to meet with us."

Jumper reminded the commissioners that the city was invited to the Landfill Advisory Committee meeting in December but said they did not attend the meeting. It was at that meeting that tipping fees were discussed. He said he anticipates their attendance at this year's meeting.
