Faith doesn't fear shadows

Groundhog Day was celebrated Tuesday. According to folklore, if a groundhog emerges from its burrow on this day and fails to see its shadow, it will leave the burrow, signifying that winter will soon end.

If, on the other hand, the groundhog sees its shadow, it supposedly will retreat into its burrow, and winter will continue for six more weeks.

The most famous groundhog is Punxsutawney Phil, who makes his predictions from his home in Punxsutawney, Pa., but when I lived in Atlanta, General Beauregard Lee, known as "Beau" to his friends, was the winter/spring prognosticator for the southeast.

Regardless of which critter I relied on for my hope that spring would soon be here, I always thought it odd that a sunny day would send Phil or Beau skittering back into his hole, while clouds, rain or even snow meant that spring was waiting in the wings. I was told that the groundhog was afraid of his shadow, and that was what sent him underground. Even though the sun is shining, fear of a shadow across his path sends him on the run.

Fear. Our culture has become surrounded with messages to be afraid. Politicians make us afraid so they will get our vote. Advertisements make us afraid so they can get our money, and even churches use the fear of God's wrath to bring in members.

But God is not about instilling fear, but quelling it, assuring us of divine protection and care. "Fear not" is the greeting that comes whenever God or God's messenger is about to announce news. From Abraham through Moses and Joshua and the prophets, God assured the people that the Lord was with them, and if they trusted in God's presence, they would have nothing to fear. In the New

Testament, Zechariah, Joseph and Mary are all greeted with, "Do not be afraid." Jesus often spoke these words as he ministered and brought healing to the people. When he came to the disciples after his resurrection, he greeted them, "Why are you frightened?" (Luke 24:38, NRSV). Jesus was all about easing fear. And in the Book of Revelation, the very first words that God speaks are, "Do not be afraid" (Rev. 1:17, NRSV). If we truly know and trust the

promises of God, fully revealed and present with us in Jesus Christ, we should not be afraid, especially of the shadows that cross our path throughout our life. Admittedly there are things that we should have a healthy fear about, but it is the lurking shadows, the less than rational "what ifs" that can lead us to trust more in the principalities and powers of this world than in the promises of Christ.

When we believe that Jesus is the light of the world, when we trust that his light will overcome any encroaching darkness, then we also believe that his strength is sufficient enough for us to face any shadowy "what ifs" that can pull us away from faith and hope in God. But often, when faced with an anxious situation, we see shadows around us, become afraid and are tempted to run into our holes and miss the light that can

strengthen us and give us hope. When we are rooted in God's grace, we need not be anxious about anything because we know God will give us whatever we need to meet any challenge. We

can react with fear and become scared groundhogs running for cover, retreating into our burrow, or respond with faith, showing strength as people saved by the light of God's grace through Jesus Christ.

Those shadowy "what ifs" will always be with us. We are afraid of looking foolish, of being wrong, of too much change in our lives. We worry about those who are different from us and get stressed when faced with a new situation. Old childhood wounds become adult anxieties, and too much trying too hard eventually becomes not wanting to try at all.

We become afraid and react with anger, withdrawal or building walls that won't let anyone near us. Instead of reaching out to the One who can help, we look for our own remedies for fear, and, more often than not, find our fear has made things worse, not better.


We forget the love and grace we have in Christ that can give us the strength to face the shadows and safely move beyond them into God's light and peace.




