



Famous Hand


This deal occurred in the London Sunday Times Invitational Pairs. It features one of the most successful swindles ever perpetrated in this prestigious event.

Hans Kreyns and Bob Slavenburg of the Netherlands were North-South when the bidding went as shown. West led a spade, and Slavenburg, faced with a seemingly hopeless task, played the king from dummy, losing to the ace. East returned a spade, which Slavenburg ruffed. South's only real chance for the contract was 28 Dist

to steal a diamond trick, so at trick three he led a diamond, hoping West would duck. But West took the ace and led another spade, ruffed again by South.

As anyone can plainly see, declarer had to lose a club trick and go down one. But Slavenburg, well known for his ability to pull a rabbit out of a hat at the bridge table, made the contract! Deliberately ignoring dummy's K-Q-8 of diamonds, Slavenburg played four rounds of trumps, winding up in his hand in this position:

North



Slavenburg led his last trump, and West, under the illusion that he had to hold his J-7-2 of diamonds to guard against dummy's K-Q-8, discarded a club. Declarer threw a club from dummy, and now East, who likewise felt he had to keep his diamonds, also discarded a club.

Slavenburg then took the last four tricks with his A-J-9-7 of clubs to make five hearts doubled. (c)2010 King Features Syndicate Inc.
