Colby athletics book The featured speaker for the "12-letter" athletes, as well as noon Food for Thought program comments from members of state Thursday at the Prairie Museum of Art and History will be Gary Adrian, who will talk about his book, "Flight of the Eagles: A History of Colby High School Sports," a compilation of athletic statistics, records and selected photos from

1902 to May 2010. Adrian created the publication, which features the history and highlights of 15 sports, to coincide with the end of the Northwest Kansas League era for Colby High activities. Included are photographs of championship teams, individual state champions and

championship teams.

Pre-publication orders are being taken, but the book will not be printed until early June, after the conclusion of the softball, baseball and track seasons.

It will be available before the Colby High School Alumni Reunion in June, and copies will be available. Proceeds will go toward construction of a building at Dennen Field to house restrooms, home and visitor locker rooms and equipment storage for football and track.


