## Trojans stretch winning streak to six

The Colby College Trojans baseball team stretched their winning streak to six games this weekend by sweeping Brown Mackie College from Salina in a doubleheader Saturday afternoon at the college diamond.

The Trojans clobbered the Lions 12-0 in game one and took the second game 8-2.

"Our hitting is picking up a lot," said freshman pitcher Marshall Dean.

"Everyone sees everyone else hitting and they want to hit to," added sophomore Brendan Miller.

Freshman Jon Cotter hit a triple between center field and left, driving in sophomore Aritz Garcia to give Colby a 1-0 lead in the bottom of the first inning. Then sophomore Jess Cooper drove in Cotter from third with a fly out to left center. Sophomore Boston Langley homered to right centerfield to make it 3-0.

Freshman Matt Balogh singled home a run in the bottom of the second, extending the lead to 4-0. Colby got on the scoreboard again run, then Garcia drove in two Miller home from second with a single.
