# Colby girl's team won with defense

Defense was the trademark of the Lady Eagles' basketball team this season. Colby's suffocating defense helped the girls finish with a 16-7 record, reaching the finals of the substate tournament.

"The defense was the backbone of our team all season," said coach Parker McKee.

The coach said the girls' defense was able to create turnovers that led to transition baskets.

While McKee sometimes had five or six players on the floor team with a lift off the bench in most of the game, other times he would give eight or nine people significant playing time.

Junior Katherine Kaus was Colby's most consistent scorer. Her ball handling ability, size, quickness and shooting skill made her a triple threat on offense. She could drive to the bucket, post up inside or step out and knock down three pointers. She had 18 points and 10 rebounds in a victory over St. Francis earlier in the season.

Junior Kayla Hockersmith and sophomore Morgan Bell usually picked up the slack when Kaus wasn't scoring as much as usual. Hockersmith, starting at point guard for her second straight season, was one of the team's best defenders. She consistently showed a knack for getting steals. Hockersmith had 12 steals in the girls' 45-24 win over Atwood on Feb. 19. She also came up big in Colby's 44-27 win over Kingman in the first round of the Class 4A substate, scoring a team-high 18.

Bell became a serious scoring threat on offense late in the season. She led the team with 19 points against arch rival Goodland on eight of 10 shooting. Her performance helped Colby hammer

the Cowgirls 45-30, avenging a loss earlier in the season. Bell also scored a team-high 14 in Colby's 42-30 victory over Clearwater in the substate semifinals.

Junior Katrina Kaus was one of the team's best defenders. Coach McKee said he always had Katrina guard the other team's best offensive player. She also used her speed to get out ahead of the defense during fast breaks.

Freshmen Lauren Bell and Alexa Haas both saw a lot of playing time this season. Bell worked her way into the starting lineup during the season and Haas provided the several games. Haas used her incredible quickness on defense to get steals, and she knocked down three-pointers and mid-range jumpers on offense. Junior Kelsey Shields was an occasional starter on this year's team. She was a solid passer who could score inside.

Junior Shelby Terrell, senior Rhett Martin and freshman Shelby Gardner all gave the Lady Eagles points off the bench. Terrell knocked down three consecutive three pointers to help Colby whip Scott City 45-27 in the Colby Orange and Black tournament.

Coach McKee said one of his team's most impressive victories was a 24-22 win at Hoxie earlier this year. The Lady Indians applied an unusual man-to-man defense in the game. The Hoxie girls played way off their people, giving Colby open three-point looks, but denying them the chance to score inside. McKee said he was proud of his team for fighting through the adversity and winning the game.
