Wieland said they wanted those eighth graders to be able to finish their middle school at the academy before it closed.

Staff Sgt. Mark Reasoner, who was the last unit administrator, was present as was Command Sgt. Maj. Manuel Rubio who served in the unit.

Among the civilians present were representatives from the city and from Northwest Tech and Chuck Lutters and his son Paul, brother to Sgt. Derrick Lutters who was killed on May 1, 2005, in an explosion in Iraq.

Bunting said he had been out to Goodland on better occasions, but that most of the time when he appears it is for a sad occasion. He said he was proud of the men and women who had served in the Goodland unit, and was sorry to have to close


