State sees job growth in January and February

TOPEKA — Kansas saw modest but atypical growth in manufacturing jobs from January to February, a sign that its economy may be improving, the state Department of Labor reported Friday.

The department also said in its monthly jobs report that the state saw a slight but better-thanaverage increase in overall employment from January to February. Also, its unemployment rate dipped to 6.8 percent in February from 7.2 percent in January.
