# Sometimes knowledge comes best from experience

As mentioned previously, I grew up going to the same denomination. I was told things about other churches that caused me to form an opinion about them. This limited what I knew to other people's opinions, most of whom didn't really know much about the group they were advising me on.

So when it came to being a part of a ministerial group I was hesitant, stemming from the lack of


## **Rotary Club**
