Josh Svaty are advising restaususpicious calls from someone claiming to be a restaurant inspector. The caller may actually be a rant's phone number to establish such as Craigslist.

"Over the past couple of days, our food safety program has been contacted by several restaurant operators who report receiving a call from someone who claims to be with the health department," said Secretary Svaty. "Our inspections are unannounced, so operators who received the call promptly alerted our agency.

All report that after the caller says a health inspector will visit soon, the caller then tells the restaurant that they will receive an automated phone call providing a five-digit number that must be given to the inspector. The inspector does not visit, but the restaurant receives a third call from the




