

Hints from Heloise

Check cans for expirations

Dear Heloise: I was visiting my 95-year-old neighbor, and she mentioned that she had lots of food (canned and dry) left over because we did not have any bad hurricanes this year. She showed me her pantry. I picked up a can and read the EXPIRATION DATE: 2002! I told her she could not use it or even donate it, because it wasn't any good. Upon further checking, half of it was more than five years old! I cleaned out all of the items that were expired.

I can't help but wonder how many elderly people are stocking up on food and not watching expiration dates! Somebody should be checking elderly family and friends and their supply of food, don't you think? - Alice in Port St. Lucie, Fla.

Alice, how right you are, and how wonderful to be so neighborly. Here's the "scoop" on safe storage of staples: The United States Department of Agriculture states that canned food that is highly acidic (e.g., grapefruit, pineapple and tomatoes) has a shelf life of one year to 18 months.

Canned meat, fish, poultry and other low-acid foods will keep for two to five years. The ideal storage is in a clean, dry, dark and cool place. -Heloise

REFRIGERATOR SHELVES

Dear Heloise: This is in regard to the hint about using glass cutting boards on refrigerator shelves. The tempered glass in our refrigerator broke. HANDY COFFEE FILTER



A Handy Defensive Device

Through the years, many conventions have been devised to help the defenders learn about each other's hands. One of these conventions, 21 perhaps not as well known as some of the others, 24 is the trump echo.

Today's hand illustrates the value of this convention. South is in four spades, and West leads his singleton diamond. East wins the trick with the ace and, diagnosing the situation correctly, returns the eight of diamonds, trumped by West with the three of spades.

West shifts to a heart, and South takes East's king with the ace. Declarer crosses to dummy with a club and leads the jack of spades. East puts up the ace, West following with the deuce. East then returns another diamond, which West ruffs with the six, and the contract is defeated. Simple enough, but without the guiding light

furnished by the trump echo, East might not have found the winning defense. The echo - West's play of the three of spades followed later by the deuce – indicated that he started with three trumps. East therefore knew that West could ruff another diamond, so he had nothing to think But what if there were no such convention as

the trump echo? In that case, East would have had a difficult problem to solve, and he might easily have gone wrong. He would have had to guess whether declarer started with five or six spades. If South did have six spades originally, a dia-

mond return would be futile, since West would have no more trumps. Then only a heart return, in the hope that West had the queen, would offer any chance of defeating the contract. Problems of this sort are solved very nicely by

the trump echo.


