"It is actually cheaper to buy it rather than produce it," said power plant Superintendent Greg Ellis, "but the fact that we have the capability to produce it makes it easier for us to negotiate for a better price.

"It comes in big (in voltage) and goes out small. We reduce it down through transformers."

Meet Me at the Flagpole began with a group of high-school students in Burleson, Texas, in April 1990. After meeting for prayer one day, they decided to go to three public schools and pray around the campus flag poles for their friends and fellow students. This avoided rules about prayer in public

By July, 20,000 other students had been challenged

to organize prayer in their school. Over 445,000 students in 1,200 schools participated in prayer around the flag pole that year. The event went national in 1998, with over 3 million students in all 50 states and 20 other countries holding prayer around their school's flagpole.

The U.S. Constitution protects our right to public prayer, just as it protects its citizens from stateimposed prayer, according to the National Day of Prayer website at www.religioustolerance.org.
