Star pitcher walks out on team

Colby College freshman Holly Denny got upset and walked away from the team before the second half of the Lady Trojans' doubleheader against Garden City Community College Monday at Carl

Coach Ryan Sturdy said he had nothing else to say until he looked into the situation. Denny has been the Lady Trojans most dominant pitcher and most consistent power hitter this season.

On the mound, she is 16-8 with a 1.21 earned run average and 194 strikeouts. Denny is leading the team at the plate at .396 with 10 home runs and 30 runs batted in.

Denny came on in relief in the top of the eighth in the first game. She got on base in the bottom of the inning, but made the second out when she was thrown out trying to steal third. Garden City got the third out and held on to an 8-7 lead as the Colby rally faded.

Apparently, there was an argument in the dugout between games that ended with Denny walking
