



# Composting makes rich soil

Dear Readers: COMPOSTING is a great way to make rich soil and mulch for the yard and flower beds, and to surround new saplings to keep weeds at bay. Grass clippings, vegetable peels, coffee grounds and eggshells are great basics for a compost pile.

To get started composting, you need an out-door, sunny area. Five feet by 5 feet should be plenty of room. Experts suggest equal parts of brown material (fallen leaves, coffee grounds, twigs) and green material (grass cuttings, pulled weeds and vegetable bits), and mix in some shovelfuls of soil to make about 3 to 4 cubic feet of compost. Never put meat trimmings, fish or dairy products in your compost pile. These items can attract critters to the compost. The mixture should be slightly damp, so you might need to add some water. The key to rapid composting is to turn the mixture at least once a week. If there's a bad odor from the pile, turn it more often! – Heloise

#### TRAVEL HINT

Dear Heloise: A very important travel hint is to check out the emergency exits as soon as you get to your hotel room. Usually the inside door has a map and indications where the emergency exits are. You should go outside your door and plan which way would be the easiest and closest to the exit. Then count the number of doorways. It might be smoky if you exit in a fire situation, and you might be crawling to get away from the smoke. Know how many doors you will pass. – Jane in New Jersey

#### **DISHES CLEAN OR DIRTY**

Dear Heloise: I keep a small cup in the front of the top basket of my dishwasher where it is easy to see. The cup fills with water when the dishwasher runs a load. When I empty the clean dishes, I dump the water out of the cup. So, if there is water in the cup, I know the dishes are clean. Mineral deposits build up on the cup, so make sure to use one you don't plan to use for anything else. – Judy, Fountain Valley, Calif.

Good idea, and here's another from Carolyn in Marble Falls, Texas. She says: "Immediately after emptying clean dishes, I add dishwasher soap to the dispenser. I use the pre-mix packets. Make sure the dispenser soap "pocket" is dry, insert the packet and close. If the door is closed and soap is in the dispenser, the dishes are dirty." – Heloise

# HANDY WOODEN CLOTHESPIN

Dear Heloise: Wooden spring clothespins work well as identifiers for potted plants. Use a marker to write on the clothespin, and clip it to the edge of the pot. – Doris, via e-mail

### UNZIPPED

## Bidding Quiz

1. One spade. Since you're required to respond with six or more points, the only problem is whether to bid one spade or one notrump. The spade response is clearly better, since partner might have four spades, and you might miss a good spade contract if you respond one notrump.

Contrary to the belief of some, the one-spade response does not promise greater values than a response of one notrump. Both responses indicate six or more points; the big difference is that the spade response has no upper limit, while the upper limit of one notrump is normally 10 points.

2. Three clubs. With 19 high-card points facing presumably 13 or more, you are obviously in the slam zone. The usual way of alerting partner to this situation is via a jump-shift. True, your clubs are not robust, but that is a minor consideration compared with the advantage of putting partner on notice that the strong possibility of a slam exists

The hand is too strong for a direct response of three notrump, which would portray your distribution accurately but would understate your high-card values by two or three points.

3. Two hearts. It is tempting to respond with one spade, but that would be the wrong bid. Your hand fits the description of a raise to two hearts: adequate trump support and six to 10 points in high cards and distribution.

A response of one spade might easily create a bidding problem later on that would be difficult to solve. For example, if partner were to rebid two hearts, you'd have to face the question of whether to bid again. A pass would suppress your heart support, while a raise to three hearts would amount to bidding twice on a hand worth only one bid. The easiest way to avoid such difficulties is to raise partner at once and let him take it from there.

4. One spade. Here you have three bids to con-

sider – one spade, one notrump and two clubs. The best response over the long haul is one spade. As usual, the emphasis is on seeking a major-suit fit. The spade response also leaves room for a low-level notrump contract, while a one-notrump response bypasses the opportunity to find a spade fit. A two-club response must be ruled out because it would promise 10 or more points, which you don't have.
