## New basketball coach won't settle for average

New Colby High basketball coach Jerad Johnson is not satisfied with his team being just respectable this winter.

"It's not about whether or not we will be competitive, it's whether or not we will make state," Johnson said.

The new coach said he wants to bring prestige and a tradition of winning back to the basketball program.

"When people talked about Colby, they used to talk about our basketball program," said Johnson.

The coach played basketball for the high school when the Eagles were a force to be reckoned with. His team went to state his sophomore year in 1997-1998 and they won the class 4A State championship his junior season. During his high school career Johnson played with Colby High girls basketball coach Parker McKee - one year younger than Johnson - and Colby Community College men's basketball coach Dustin Pfeifer. Johnson played with Parker's older brother Spencer McKee the year the team won state.

"The basketball program here is about more than just basketball to me; it's a tradition," the coach said.

Johnson grew up in Colby and has lived here all his life, except for the four years – 2000-2003 – when he played defensive back for the Kansas State Wildcats football team under the guidance of legendary coach Bill Snyder.

#### years at the college and they also won two bowl games. During his senior year, the Wildcats picked up arguably the biggest win in the program's history when they defeated No. 1 ranked Oklahoma 35-7 in the Big 12 Championship.

Johnson said he returned to Colby after college because he always felt like he had a connection with the community. He said coaching is a way he can give back to the community. Johnson said he loves working with the kids at the high school and coaching was an opportunity to give back to the kids.

Johnson is already the assistant coach of the high school football team. He will be going into his seventh year as coach this fall. When he's not coaching Johnson works as a crop consultant for Leanna Tubbs-Soehner.

The coach said his practices will be run at game speed and will focus on eliminating team weaknesses. Practices will be intense, competitive and focused, Johnson said.

The coach said a player's work ethic in practice can say a lot about that person.

"The kid whose willing to sweat and bleed for you is a kid you can trust when the game is on the line," the Johnson said.

Johnson wants the middle school and high school basketball teams to be seen as one program instead of two separate entities. He said he wants the high school players to interact with the middle school kids and he wants the middle schoolers to be comfortable with the high school players.

The coach said he is still working on a schedule of activities for his players this summer. These activities include workout sessions, a basketball league


