Professor plans webinar on greenhouse gasses

MANHATTAN — Frank Mitloehner, a University of Califor- nia-Davis associate professor and air quality specialist, traces much of the public confusion over meat and milk's role in climate change to two sentences in a 2006 United Nations report, titled "Livestock's Long Shadow."

Printed only in the report's ex- ecutive summary and nowhere in the body of the report, the sen- tences read: "The livestock sec- tor is a major player, responsible for 18 percent of greenhouse gas emissions measured in CO2e (car- bon dioxide equivalents). This is a

higher share than transport."

Those statements are not ac- curate, Mitloehner said, yet their wide distribution has put Ameri- cans and others on the wrong path toward "solutions."

Mitloehner will present his views at 1:30 p.m. June 11 in a free webinar, "Animal Ag's Role in Greenhouse Gas Production: A Closer Look." Rick Stowell, University of Nebraska Extension specialist focusing on air quality in animal agriculture, will be the moderator.
