



Dear Heloise: Several years ago, my wife was teaching at a school where she had several highschool students attend a national convention. There would be a lot of inexperienced travelers at the BAGGAGE CAROUSEL, and a lot of confusion. Some of the students had not experienced travel by air.

I suggested the group stick brightly colored file-folder labels on all sides of each piece of their baggage - all using the same color(s) of labels. Yes, a very helpful hint! You can attach some self-gripping tape or a big safety pin to close the pocket so nothing goes AWOL! - Heloise


BATHROOM ORGANIZATION







Bidding Quiz

1. Four hearts. You should have no qualms about raising with only two trumps in this sequence. Partner's jump-rebid in hearts is virtually certain to be based on a strong six-card or longer suit. Raising to four does not imply extra values beyond those already shown by the two-club bid, since partner's three-heart bid compels you to bid again.

The objection to bidding four clubs is that partner might raise to five, and there is no reason to 16 think that an 11-trick contract in clubs would be easier to make than a 10-trick heart contract.

2. Four notrump. The three-heart bid should 18 strongly rouse your interest in reaching a grand slam. If partner has solid hearts and two aces – not much to ask for – 13 tricks are all but assured.

Point count won't help resolve that problem, but the number of aces partner holds almost surely will. If he shows two aces in response to Blackwood and then also shows at least one king, a grand slam becomes mandatory. If he indicates only one ace instead, you should bid six hearts 27 anyway.

3. Three spades. Prospects for a small slam are 29 exceptionally bright if partner can support either clubs or spades. If he bids four clubs, or raises three spades to four, promising four-card support, you should next try Blackwood. Provided you are not missing two aces, you will then carry on to six of your suit.

If partner retreats to four hearts or three notrump, you should throw in the sponge. His inability to raise either of your suits, or to try for a slam in his own suit despite your constructive bidding, should persuade you to give up.

4. Five hearts. A four-heart bid would not reflect the exceptionally good support you have for a heart contract. For a typical example of a fourheart bid, see the first problem.


True, you have only 13 points in high cards, but the distribution and good suit controls make the hand very attractive for slam purposes. It is unlikely that partner would lose two tricks if he voluntarily bid six.

A Blackwood inquiry for aces is not apt to resolve the problem of deciding how high to go. Allowing partner to use his judgment, rather than you using yours, will probably lead to the best contract.
