State Kids group has tips for safety on carnival rides

and having fun can and should go hand in hand.

"Parents need to use their own judgment. Posted age and height requirements are minimal guidelines," says Cherie Sage, State Director of Safe Kids Kansas. "Following the rules is also important. If a ride operator tells you to keep your hands and feet inside the car, hold the handrail or remain seated, there's a good reason for doing that - it helps make the ride safer."

Every year, about 8,000 children suffer injuries that require treatment in an emergency room from rides. Injuries involve fixed rides, mobile rides, inflatables and other types of rides at amusement parks, festivals, traveling carnivals and other locations.

In Kansas, the owner/ operator is required to carry liability insurance, but there is otherwise no state government safety oversight. Parents need to decide whether their children can sit properly on a ride and follow the instructions.

Follow these tips to help keep rides safer for children of all

• Role-model proper safety behavior. Children are more likely to

follow rules when parents do. • Supervise your child getting on and off a ride. Make sure the child understands announcements and rules. Don't allow older chil-

dren to supervise younger children • Always use safety belts, lap bars, chains, handrails and other

safety features. • Be careful when getting off. complete stop. If a ride stops due to a mechanical or safety problem, stay seated and wait for instruc-

• Don't let children ride if they're too tired or scared to comply with safety procedures. Don't pressure kids to go on a ride they're afraid of, as they're more likely to sit in-

correctly or even try to get off. Note the limitations of safety devices. Lap bars and chains are not physical restraints – their main function is to remind the occupant to stay seated.

• Trust your instincts. If a ride looks poorly maintained or an operator seems inattentive or unfit, don't let your children ride.


