

# College board votes to keep pool amid outcry

Mandy Lanning, a vice president of the Colby Swim Club, said the club uses the pool quite a bit. Dawn Stephens, a physical therapist, said the elderly do very well in the pool and injured athletes also use the pool.

"I think we have done a very poor job in this area," he said.

"We have been talking about solar for the pool since the day I got here," said President Lynn

Barry Kaaz, dean of external affairs, said the most costly part of maintaining the pool is heating it. He said reducing the volume of water in the pool would be the best way to save money.

"The pool volume could be reduced by 60 percent," said Kaaz.

He said the costs would have to be reduced in a way that would be best for people who do water exercises and swim laps. Kaaz also said seven of the natural gasfed infra-red heaters that heat the air above the pool need to be replaced.

Kip Nelson, pool manager and Board member Arlen Leiker athletic trainer at the college, said said he didn't think the school had putting chemicals in the pool costs \$7,000 to \$10,000. He said the repairs budget is \$11,000 not including the infra-red heaters. The combined costs for heating the

Nelson said.

Board member Kenton Kreibel said he thought the board should have all its ducks in a row before it closes the pool.

"If we need to be remodeling the pool, we need to plan ahead and select a time to close it," he

Kreibel added the board needed to make sure all the money is available to make the proper fixes to the pool before they close it. Member Bill Shields asked Nick

Wells, endowment foundation director, if the foundation could help pay to maintain the pool. Wells said they could earmark donations for the pool. Kreider said he thought the

85-degree temperature of the pool is too high. He also said he thought groups such as the swim club should be paying more to use the pool. The president added that the school would need to look around for grants that could help pay to make the pool more economical and energy-efficient.

## Democrat hopefuls debate in Wichita

ocrats tried to show in a televised debate why they would be the best candidate in the upcomseat in Kansas.

Five Democrats are seeking their party's nomination, but Robert Conroy, the fifth Democratic in the race and a retired railroad engineer, declined to participate in the debate Monday night in Wichita.

In the 30-minute debate, Democrat State Sen. David Haley of Kansas City said he had a record of working with Republicans in the Legislature. Haley, an attorney, is the only one of the four to have held office.

But other candidates, including Lisa Johnston, an assistant administrative dean at Baker University, cited voter appeal for outsiders, according to The Wichita Eagle.

"Kansans want a leader, not career politicians," said Johnston, of Overland Park. Patrick Wiesner, an accoun-

tant and attorney from Lawrence, said, "This is an election

worked on four successful con-

gressional campaigns. Haley, Johnston and Schollenberger supported the extension of unemployment benefits and saw health care as a right. But Wiesner differed.

"I don't find it in the Constitution that there is a right to get health care from the government or an employer," Wiesner said.

Schollenberger said unemployment is the nation's most pressing issue, while Haley cited easing gridlock in Congress as one of his top concerns.

Johnston said she wanted to see the focus on education, but she would push to move away from the federal No Child Left Behind education law.

Wiesner, an Army reservist who returned in May from his second tour in Iraq, said his first priority would be to get out of Iraq in 2011.
