Wayne, 91, now lives in Salt Lake City. Another brother, Dallas, served in Europe and then in the occupation of Japan.
"My mother would have been so proud," he said, "and is probably rejoicing in heaven that her family has been so honored."
Hamill said he has seven wonderful children, all educated and with good jobs. Barbara, the oldest, lives in Denton, Texas; Albert, Mike, Kevin and Amy all live in the Fort Collins area; Glenna lives in Arlington, Texas, and K.C. in Amarillo.
Hamill said he will be travel-

ing Sept. 12-14 as a guest with Honor Flight of Northern Colorado, which so far has flown 594 veterans to Washington. Over all, Honor Flight Network's goal is to fly 25,000 World War II, Korea and Vietnam veterans a year to see their memorials.
The group says it is a nonprofit organization created to honor America's veterans for all their sacrifices, and all trips are free to the veterans.
Their website, www.honor-flight.org, says the group transports America's heroes to Washington to visit and reflect at the memorials that have been erected in their honor.

The Superfund site treats water contaminated with chromium, she said. It was set up about 10 years ago. The water became contaminated years ago when a chrome-plating company was dumping residue outside the building, Bieber said. The treated water is used in the city's water supply system.
Discussed the possibility that the county commissioners may decide to quit paying for the tornado sirens in the city. County Commissioner Paul Steele said no decision had been made, but he said he felt he and his fellow commissioners had formed a consensus to stop covering the maintenance costs of the sirens.
He suggested installing a siren by the new pool before paving is begun. Steele added that the city should look at a map so it can be sure to put the sirens where everyone in town can hear them.
