

Following her graduation, Pauline enrolled in nursing college in nearby Hays, Kansas. She became a registered nurse, and took a job at County Indian Hospital in Albuquerque, New Mexico. It was in Albuquerque where she met and married Charles Steadmon in 1957. Charles, an Air Force veteran, had recently graduated from the University of New Mexico and was a teacher. Pauline went on to serve as a nurse at St. Joseph's Hospital and later, Presbyterian Hospital, before the Steadmons started their family. In order of appearance, Patrice, Lisa, Paul and John were born. While moving the family to various hotels that Charles managed across the nation, Pauline could not ignore her calling to help others through her profession as a nurse. She went back to school in the 1970s and earned accreditation for her new career as a psychiatric nurse. Pauline was able to juggle her work at home of raising a family with her full-time job of helping troubled children at a special hospital in Scottsdale. In retirement, Pauline was a fearless world traveler, twice catching a plane to West Germany to visit her daughter Patrice and son-in-law Bill while they were stationed there with the Army.
