



Hints from Heloise

Follow policies when child flies

Dear Readers: Do you need to send a CHILD ALONE ON A TRIP by commercial airline? Airlines have procedures that must be followed, and most policies are similar, but you should check with the specific airline you are using.

An unaccompanied minor may range from 5 to 17 years old. There usually is an additional fee. If the child is flying alone, let the airline know when making the reservation.

The Transportation Security Administration will provide an escort pass, which allows you to take your child right to the gate. You must stay at the gate until take off, in case there is a problem.

A person you designate will be allowed to pick up the child from the airline representative or flight attendant at the gate upon arrival. When making the reservation, provide the name, address and phone number of the person who is picking up your child. Be sure that person has a government-issued identification and a current photo ID. The airline will hand off the child only to that predesignated person.

Make sure the child has, a cell phone or calling card for an emergency. Check the weather several times before heading to the airport. The airlines book unaccompanied minors on early flights, in

case there are weather-related or other delays. Before booking a flight for an unaccompanied minor, check the airline's and airport's websites,

or call with any questions. - Heloise **SHOWER-CURTAIN REPAIR**

Test Your Play

1. The best way to avoid a spade loser is to try for a dummy reversal. Ruff the second heart with the king of diamonds and cash the J-9 of trumps. If the adverse trumps are divided 3-2, ruff the

eight of hearts (assume the ace does not fall). Then lead a club to dummy's jack and ruff the heart king with your last trump. Now lead a club to the queen and cash the queen of trumps, discarding your spade loser, and the rest of the tricks are yours.

All told, you score six trump tricks (dummy's Q-J-9 and the three heart ruffs in your hand), two spades and four clubs. This type of play is called "dummy reversal" because declarer reverses the usual procedure of ruffing losers in dummy and instead ruffs dummy's losers in his hand.

2. The correct lead at trick three is the ten of hearts! This seemingly aimless play offers the best chance for the contract, since the North hand probably looks something like:


♥KJ ♦ J 9 8 6 ♣J4

If you don't lead the ten of hearts and instead play the A-K of clubs, planning next to ruff a low club in dummy, North can defeat you by trumping the third club, leading the heart jack to his partner's ace and trumping a club return by South.

The purpose of the early heart play is to remove South's heart entry prematurely and thus assure the contract even if North has only a doubleton club. If you make the heart play at trick three, the only tricks you can lose – assuming North has a hand similar to the one shown – are a heart and a diamond.




