Eagles suffer first loss on road

The Colby High varsity football team suffered its first loss of the year on Friday, falling to Scott City 42-14 in a road game.

"We came out a little intimidated and we didn't execute," senior fullback Ryan Parker said.

The Beavers jumped out to an early lead thanks to a strong running game. Scott City's running backs gained large chunks of yardage in the first quarter with runs to the outside and up the middle. The Beavers' first scoring drive featured 29- and 37-yard runs. Scott City's quarterback Ron Baker finished the drive with a two-yard quarterback sneak to make it 6-0. The extra point was good.

The Eagles' offense was inconsistent throughout the first half. Scott City eventually extended its lead to 21-0 after Dalton Buehler caught a pass and ran for a 41yard touchdown.

Colby went on a sustained drive featuring some tough runs by Parker and senior taliback Andrew Flanagin. The Eagles marched down near the Beavers' goal line. It looked like Colby's drive might not yield any points, but senior quarterback Kale Arnberger was able to get a first down on a fourth down and short situation.

A few plays later, Arnberger found senior wide receiver Corbin Stephens with a pass in the end zone, cutting the Beavers' lead to 21-6. Sophomore Trek Keck booted the extra point.

Scott City came right back and scored a touchdown. Baker found Brayden Robinson with a 37-yard completion that left Scott City at Colby's 7 yard line. Moments later, the Beavers' Colburn Couchman took the hand-off and ran it in for a touchdown with a little over a minute remaining in the half.

Scott City made its first big mistake in the third. The Beavers' ball carrier fumbled a pitch that was a little behind him, allowing senior defensive end Rocque Russell to recover it on the Beavers' own 26.

Flanagin and Parker both gained solid yards on runs thanks in part to holes created by the Eagles'
