"Loans covering physical and/ or production losses may be made at a 3.75 percent interest rate, and are scheduled for repayment as rapidly as feasible," Jurey said.

To be eligible, an applicant must be operating a family-size farm or ranch and unable to get credit elsewhere. Farmers who suffered at least a 30 percent reduction to a crop or enterprise may qualify.




