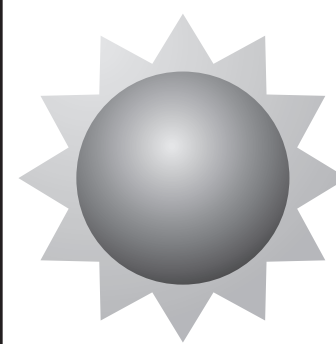


Weather Corner

# Church celebrates anniversary

parents, a beautiful young girl of 13. She is said to have paid no regard to her suitors, remarking that she could have no other spouse but Christ. As a result, the Roman governor had her executed by fire or the sword. She is quoted as saying, "You may stain your sword with my blood, but you will never be able to profane my body, consecrated to Christ."

On April 28, 1928, fire destroyed the church and rectory. The flames spread so quickly that nothing important could be saved and most of the parish records were destroyed. The high school basement was used for services until a new church could be constructed. The new church was first built as a basement and added onto later. The church basement was first used on Palm Sunday 1929.

It was decided in 1947 not to build on the basement church because it was not considered large enough for the growing needs of the parish. The basement was used for a parish hall until the present Education Center was built.

The planning for the construction of the church began in 1948. The church was to seat 450 people and was to be built of brick and stone trim. Construction began in the fall of 1949. About 1,000 people attended the cornerstone laying on Jan. 20, 1950. The Monsignor John G. Wolf presided.

The most striking feature of the church is its stained glass windows, which were installed in 1958. Nearly a year was spent designing the windows, which were fabricated in Holland.

The parish needed a place for religious education and for meetings, so St Agnes Education Center was constructed in 1964. It was completed with a full kitchen, large multipurpose room, classrooms, library and restrooms. It is used for youth education, retreats, a meeting place for the St Agnes Ladies Organization and Knights of Columbus, prayer services and wakes, funeral dinners, parish picnics, Labor Day sales, and other activities. Demolition of the old basement church took place in 1975.

With the decline in the number of priests, lay members have been encouraged to take a more active role in the church. St. Agnes Parish became a mission parish to Sacred Heart Parish in Park in 1993. In July 2009, Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary Parish, Grinnell, joined St. Agnes as a mission parish.

Religious vocations from St. Agnes Parish include two priests, the Revs. Ernest Gallagher and Bill Kraus, Brother Gerald Selenke, and Sisters Mary Mattern, Eileen Marie Mattern, Gregory Kraus, Roserita Weber, Elizabeth Gallagher, Agnes Dreher, Christina Meyer and Carlene Headrick.

# Efficiency program sees little interest

LAWRENCE (AP) - A federal initiative designed to encourage homeowners to improve energy efficiency has had little participation in Kansas.

Some energy auditors hope a partnership proposal from Westar Energy Inc. could save the state program.

Since the state was awarded the stimulus money last November, only 58 Kansas residents have sought loans for projects such as sealing windows and doors, insulation and new windows, The Lawrence Journal-World reported Monday.

The program, called Efficiency Kansas, allows homeowners to take out up to \$20,000 for energy

efficiency projects. The 38 loans have used about \$386,000 of the \$38 million, which the state must spend by April 2012.

Until now, the state has partnered with banks and smaller utilities but set no stipulations on how banks lend the money. Many of the banks require homeowners to take out a second mortgage, have a high credit score and 20 percent or more equity in their home.

The loans also came with a 4 percent interest rate.

Westar is proposing a plan to charge a \$240 fee and allow consumers to take out a loan through the utility and repay it through their energy bill. Westar wouldn't charge interest and if the house

sold, the new occupants would make payments on the loan through their energy bill.

tion classes. The association holds classes for board members throughout the year and gives points for attending.

• Heard grade school Principal Lance Krannawitter report on how lunch is going now that the grade school cafeteria is closed and students from the grade and middle schools all eat in the middle school.

The first few days were a challenge, he said, making sure the halls at the intermediate building didn't get congested. Now, the teachers and administrators have timed things so that the classes don't have to pass each other in the halls.

"From what I observed, it's going really well," Krannawitter said.

• Heard high school Principal Larry Gabel say he is continuing the early release program started by his predecessor, Don Krebs. The program allows students who have no Ds, Fs or

• Approved out-of-district field trips for the year, including a second-grade trip to the Fick Fossil Museum in Oakley, an eighth-grade field trip to the Wildlife Center in Salina, and high school "Physics Day" at Elitches in Denver.

• Approved hiring Carol Hunter and Sharon Jumper as special education teaching assistants, replacing assistants who quit. Harrison said both Hunter and Jumper live in the area and Jumper has been a teacher.

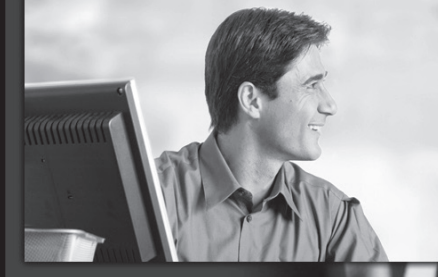
