Has your expecter expired?

Has your expecter expired? Mo-thinkers. tivational speaker John Maxwell – and it's worth considering in the light of scripture.

Joshua 1:7-9 (NIV) says, "Be them? strong and very courageous.... do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go."

With a promise like that, you'd think the people of Israel would expect God's miracles in their lives. After all, God led them out of Egypt, through the sea on dry ground, gave them food in the desert and stayed with them in a pillar of cloud by day and a pillar of fire at night – but no. They were just like us.

Numbers 13 tells of Moses sending an advance party to explore Canaan. He told the men to evaluating the land, the people and the towns.

They returned carrying an enorbetween two men and telling of the abundance to be found. "But the people who live there are powerful," they said, proceeding to paint a picture of an unconquerable people.

Then Caleb spoke up. "We should go up and take possession of the land, for we can certainly do it." But his minority report was shouted down by the negative so forth.

> Numbers 14 continues: "That night all the people of the community raised their voices and wept.... Why is the Lord bringing us to this land only to let us fall by the sword?'

> Joshua and Caleb argued that the Lord would lead his people into the land and give it to them, but the assembly threatened to stone them.

> Because the people of Israel refused to trust God and follow God's appointed leaders, they were condemned to wander for 40 years in the desert and die there!

What's the problem? The people go through the Negev and beyond, of God stopped expecting great things from God.

Ephesians 3:20-21 says, "Now to him who is able to do immeamous cluster of grapes on a pole surably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, for ever and ever! Amen."

Do you have an expired expecter? John Maxwell defines the symptoms as being judgmental of others in the church, starting or passing on negative rumors, and

Maxwell wrote, "Many people are not receiving miracles in their lives because their expecter has expired. Once they had dreams, now they have doubts. The future looked bright, now it looks bleak.... If this has happened to you, revitalize your expecter..."

Your life must be influenced by positive expectations, not experiences that leave you bitter, unforgiving, victimized or self-pitying. Don't make the mistake of believing that things never change. This cheats you out of developing your potential.

You may feel God can't be trusted – just look at the evil and pain in the world. Think it through. God had a choice – give men and women free will to choose right or wrong, or make them robots and control every movement. If he gives free will, they can choose to love him and live in relationship with him. Of course, that also means there will be sin and sickness in the world, because some will reject God.

Your life must be influenced by

positive expectations, not others' poor examples. We all have heroes, but don't let them become idols because eventually you'll become disillusioned. Don't let other's failures keep you from expecting miracles from God. Don't let your own failures con-

vince you God has rejected you. God will always love you and when you repent, restore you and grow you into something greater because you humbled yourself before God.

Your life must be influenced by positive expectations, not passing exhilaration. Moods change quickly. Decisions should be independent of moods, based on evidence and sound thinking. If you follow emotion, you'll stop doing something God has called you to do just short of success, because you don't feel like it. If you follow emotions only, you'll never take on any ministry that might push you out of your comfort zone because you don't feel like do-

Take risks for God. Expect God to show up and do something awe-


