

Colby freshman Jace Campbell finished 3-2 at 141 pounds. Campbell beat Markos Serna of Western Wyoming 8-5, won a 13-0 major decision over unattached wrestler Edward Zuckerman and a 7-0 decision over Dillon Karajanis of Western Wyoming. He was pinned by Avery Garner of Utah State and at the University of Northern Colorado starting at 9 he lost a 4-1 decision to unattached wrestler Kevin a.m. (Central Time) on Saturday in Greeley.


