the status quo in his chamber, despite the changes.

"I do anticipate that the Senate will remain a stable voice in policy making," Schmidt said. "That's an institutional characteristic more than it is a function of individual personalities."

Senators serve four-year terms, and seats normally are filled in presidential election years, an arrangement that favors Republicans in a state that hasn't voted for a Democrat for president since Lyndon Johnson in 1964.

This year, Republican Sens. Terrie Huntington, Fairway, and Jeff Longbine, Emporia, faced special elections because they'd been appointed by GOP precinct committee members to fill midterm vacancies. Long-

Jim Barnett, also an Emporia Republican, when she's confirmed by the Senate. resigned after losing the primary in the 1st Congressional District, so he hasn't served when lawmakers are in session.

As with Huntington and Longpine, vacancies will be filled by precinct committee members of the departing senator's party. Governors traditionally go through the formality of appointing whoever is selected; if they don't, the new senator takes his or her seat anyway.

Sen. Tim Huelskamp, a Fowler Republican, won the 1st Congressional District seat, and Sen. Jeff Colyer, an Overland Park Republican, was elected lieutenant governor on Brownback's ticket.

Gov. Mark Parkinson announced that state Sen. Janis Lee, a Kensington Democrat, bine joined the Senate when former Sen. the state Court of Tax Appeals, resigning Committee Chairman Jay Emler, of Linds-

Her departure is a blow to the Legislature's rural bloc because of her knowledge of the state's school funding formula - and her willingness to challenge urban and suburban legislators when changes are discussed. It's a loss for the Senate as a whole because of her knowledge of tax issues, and it's a blow to the Democrats because her GOP-leaning district is now more likely to be recaptured by a Republican in 2012.

But Schmidt's departure is the most significant, because the majority leader controls the calendar. Schmidt has remained perched between strong anti-tax, smallgovernment and anti-abortion conserva-And last week, outgoing Democratic tives and moderates like Morris. Schmidt voted against this year's tax increase.

So far, the candidates to replace Schmidt would become the chief hearing officer for as majority leader are Ways and Means
