Two Thomas County residents have been well as any special practices such as grassland development, forestry, pollution abatement, The awards are given out each year by the riparian management, water quality and residue management.

> • For the windbreak award, a landowner must provide protection from damaging winds for residential areas, livestock or fields. The original windbreak must be planted trees or shrubs while volunteer shrubs may be used to add density or fill gaps. The plants have to be healthy with no significant gaps, and the windbreak has to adequately cover the area that needs shelter. Windbreaks have to have been in place for three or more years.

> In 2010, the district gave out a grassland conservation award for quality management of grasslands, including pasture lands. Criteria include good grazing, fencing and water management practices, but not this year.

The district also runs a coloring contest There are two award categories this year, each year at area elementary schools. Finalists are published in this section and put on display at the banquet. Fifth graders at Sacred Heart Catholic School also created computer presentations on conservation. The win-






