The freshman class has been a big part of the team's success, Ortiz said. This is Ortiz's first full year with a team he recruited. He came to Colby in 2010 from the University of the Southwest in Hobbs, N.M. Some of Ortiz's team followed him when he moved to Colby, and he recruits a lot from Texas, where he has good contacts among high school coaches, as well as from Kansas and around the country. Two of the team's best runners, Alfredo Arellano and Raymond Velazquez come from Texas.

"We aren't thinking about nationals yet, our focus is this weekend at regionals. We have to find a way to score as many points as possible." Ortiz said. "Our region is highly competitive in track and field. We were seventh at region indoor and finished 15th in the nation, so we expect the competition to be just as tough."


