The girls jumped out to a 7-0 lead in the bottom of the first inning. Lead-off hitter Caitlyn Wark scored the first run, getting home on a ground out by Curry. Bailey Koerperich and Madison Gawith walked. Brittany Bange got on by an error that allowed Koerperich to score, making it 2-0.

Mengel hit a grounder to the Ulysses third baseman, who bobbled it and tried to make the throw to first, but Mengel was safe. Gawith scored on the play. Bange and Mengel would also score on wild pitches. Karly Kriss and Haileigh Shull – a freshman playing her first varsity game - both walked and then advanced on wild pitches.

With Wark at the plate for the second time in the inning, Kriss and Shull both got home on wild pitches, making it 7-0. Wark ended up walking and stole second. Raymond also walked, but Curry hit a pop fly to end the inning.

Collectively, this was a 26-4 beatdown by the first-place team the Royals have been hoping to catch up with in the AL Central.




It was a fourth straight loss by the Royals. But at least the series gave them an indication of where they need to improve.



Five boys is not a lot for a track team, but for the Brewster sixth graders, it proved just enough to capture second place at the Logan Invitational on May 5.

Jaden Schmidt brought home two gold medals, winning the shot put with a throw of 27 feet 2 inches and the 400-meter dash with a time of 1:12.18. He also placed second in the discus with 67 feet 2.5 inches.

Tad Holm placed second in the high jump, with a personal-best height of 4 feet, 4 inches. Holm also came in third in the 75-meter hurdles with 14.34 and fourth in the 200-meter dash in 32.44.

J.B. Felzien took third in the 100-meter dash with 14.81, fourth in the 75-meter hurdles with 14.92 and fifth in the 75-meter dash with 11.84. Cade Mayer, fourth in the 800-meter run with 3:00.47, seventh in the 400-meter dash with 1:21.29, and eighth in the long jump with 10 feet, .25 inches. Placing fifth in the discus with a throw of 48 feet, 7 inches was Dalton Arntt. He also placed eighth in the 75-meter dash with 13 seconds, and ninth in the shot

put with 18 feet, 10.25 inches.

For the seventh and eighth grade boys, Layton Werth ran the 1600-meter run in 5:42.15, winning first place. Werth also placed fifth in the 800-meter run with 2:35.5 and 11th in the triple jump.

C.J. Felzien placed second in the discus with a throw of 99 feet, 10 inches and eighth in the shot put with 29 feet, 10.5 inches. Takoda Turner, second in the 1600-meter run with 5:43.42, and third in both the 800-meter run with 2:29.12, and the 400-meter dash with

Jace Jorgensen placed eighth in the 100-meter dash with 13.57, fourth in the medley relay, along with Werth, Felzien and Turner with 2:04.73, and seventh in the 4-by-100 relay with team members Nathan Brown, Carl Mayer and Ismael Ornelas. Jorgensen, along with Brown, Mayer, and Ornelas, placed sixth in the 4-by-200 relay with 2:09.3.

Justin Schmidt placed sixth in the 1600-meter run with 5:59.91, ninth in the 400-meter dash with 1:12.73, and eighth in the 200-meter dash with 29.93. Brown ran the 400-meter dash, finishing 10th with 1:13.42.

On the girls' side, for the sixth

grade, Shavaun Barnes finished fifth in the 400-meter dash with 1:21.68. sixth in the 800-meter run with 3:11.49, and eighth in the 75-meter dash with 12.32. Lily Herz leaped 7 feet, 6.5 inches in the long jump for 14th place, was 10th in the 75-meter dash with 13.16, and 12th in the 100-meter dash with 16.91.

For the seventh and eighth grade girls division, Kendra Rush brought home second place in both the 100-meter dash with 14.17 and the 800-meter run with 2:44.7. She was fifth in the triple jump with 25 feet, 11.75 inches, and was a member of the medley relay team, which finished fourth.

Dara Roulier, also a member of the medley relay, was sixth in the 400-meter dash with 1:17.04, 10th in the discus with 60 feet and 14th in the shot put with 24 feet, 3.5 inches. Alicia Barrie ran the 200-meter Hurdles in 38.25 seconds for sixth place, the 100-meter hurdles in 20.97 for fifth, and was a member of the medley relay. Rachel Friess, the fourth member of the medley relay, finished fifth in the 400-meter dash in 1:16.78, 12th in the 100-meter dash in 15.44, and sixth in the long jump with 11 feet, 5.25 inches.
