Office closing roils city

city officials are trying to fight the state's decision to close the Lawrence office of the Kansas Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services, and they say a provision in the lease for the buildings that house the office might help their

Department Secretary Robert the state will close nine offices across Kansas in response to a \$42 million cut to the agency's budget, including \$1 million in administrative expenses. The Lawrence office is by far the largest of the nine, serving thousands of people and with 87 employees.

Community meetings about the potential closure have attracted hundreds of angry residents and more events are planned, including a rally Saturday in South Park.

Supporters trying to keep the office open say a provision in the lease between the department and the owner of the two buildings that house the office might require the state to reverse the decision, the Lawrence Journal-World reported. The lease says the department "shall use its best efforts to obtain annual appropriations to satisfy its obligations under this lease."

"I think this puts an affirmative obligation on them to provide for the money in their budget," said House Minority Leader Paul Davis, D-Lawrence.

Davis said the department has discretionary spending that could, and should, be allocated to fulfill

Siedlecki and his top staff said

TOPEKA(AP) — Residents and this week they are confident they would be able to terminate the lease for the Lawrence office. They said they want to work with local leaders to find a way to provide free office space for a small number of department employees.

'We want to make sure it is an

orderly process," Siedlecki said. Siedlecki has said closing the Siedlecki announced July 1 that Lawrence office will save the state \$413,385, including \$331,875 in rent. He and Gov. Sam Brownback have said that people needing department services in Lawrence can travel to Topeka, Overland Park and Ottawa, or use the Internet.

Social service advocates and law enforcement officials have responded that those ideas are not realistic and the closure will hurt many vulnerable citizens.

Price guide can save on food

Consumer advocates recommend comparison shopping when choosing big-ticket items, but doing so also can offer a savings on frequently purchased, less costly,

"Groceries are an example," said Mary Meck Higgins, K-State Research and Extension nutrition

In choosing groceries, buyers can be swayed by an advertised sale that may not be the better bargain, said Higgins, who recommends creating a personal price guide with a short list of frequently-purchased items such as milk, peanut butter, favorite cereals, bread, juices and canned vegetables and fruits.

Higgins' list (in a small notebook) has grown to include dozens of items and serves as a quick reference in recognizing bargain prices and knowing when to stock up and save.

Checking prices at more than one store can be helpful, said Higgins, who recommends creating a separate column for each store and listing prices for like products on the same line.

Consumers are encouraged to tuck their shopping list into the guide and compare prices before buying, she said. Using the guide should help consumers judge which store has the best prices on preferred items and see trends in seasonal sales and promotional


